PRESIDENT'S REPORT 24 -25

Brent Munday



This year has marked significant progress for Badminton Tasmania in participation, development programs, member, and community engagement across the state, and in improving governance and child safety practices and procedures.

Participation and development programs

Badminton Tasmania's participation and development programs have resulted in a growth in participation. Successful delivery of the Shuttle Smash - Sporting Schools Programs in both the South and North-West regions has contributed to increased visibility and engagement. A historic milestone was achieved with the first combined senior and junior state development camp in 25 years, held in Port Sorell in North Western Tasmania. Sanctioned tournaments continue to attract solid participation numbers, reflecting the sport's strong presence across Tasmania. The Shuttle Smash initiatives have seen widespread involvement: 360 participants at the Shuttle Smash - Gala Day Competition in Burnie, 40 at the Shuttle Smash - Come & Try Activation in Launceston, 9 regular participants in the Shuttle Smash - All Abilities Program in Hobart, and 139 participants across the Shuttle Smash - 10-Week Programs in Snug, Hobart, Devonport, Launceston, and Penguin. Badminton Tasmania also partnered with Variety Tasmania – The Children's Charity to deliver badminton to over 150 children during multi-sport days in Deloraine, Ulverstone, and Sorell, led by experienced coaches Lasse Bundgaard and Abbie Rothery.

Junior participation continues to grow, thanks to the dedicated efforts of Lasse Bundgaard and Matthew Gillie, whose statewide programs are driving membership and visibility. Tasmania proudly hosted the Senior National Championships in Hobart and the Under 19 & Under 15 National Championships in Launceston. Tasmanian teams were entered in all categories, highlighting the strength of our junior base. The challenge ahead is to retain these players and support their progression to senior levels. Looking forward, our focus will be on enhancing technical training through accredited coaching to strengthen our development pathways.

A veteran's tournament was successfully held in the South, although the North-West event was cancelled due to low numbers. Internationally - Linda Byrne achieved a remarkable milestone by winning the Over 70 World Singles Championship, a testament to her dedication and excellence.

Governance

During the year, Badminton Tasmania continued to improve its governance practices and procedures including the implementation of:

- a Conflict of Interest Policy and a Child Protection Risk Management Policy; following consultation with member clubs and associations and approval by the board.
- an induction process for all new board members – designed to assist new board members understand their role, be aware of their responsibilities, have a copy of key documents and understand the workings of Badminton Tasmania and its relationship with stakeholders.
- an online compliance system – requiring coaches, officials, board members and volunteers to confirm their understanding of the policies and procedures adopted by Badminton Tasmania under the National Integrity Framework, evidence their completion of compulsory training modules and to evidence their completion of essential checks, including the Working with Vulnerable People Registration. The online compliance system provides Badminton Tasmania with an efficient mechanism to maintain up-to-date compliance records and ensure consistent standards across the state.
- an education program for member clubs and associations – in December 2024, Badminton Tasmania organised a State Forum with a focus on the National Integrity Framework, Badminton Tasmania's Safeguarding Children & Young People Policy and the importance of the implementation of safeguarding practices at the member club and association level. In June 2025, Badminton Tasmania organised an education session for member clubs and associations and coaches on the National Integrity Framework, which was delivered by the National Integrity Manager at Badminton Australia.
- a Board Skills and Diversity Matrix process, under the guidance of Matthew Etherington - Project Officer at Active Tasmania - to assess the current skills, experience and diversity on the board and what will be needed in the future for Badminton Tasmania to achieve its strategic priorities and operational goals. This process has informed the board about future recruitment priorities, future development opportunities to upskill current directors and has positioned us well for the future.
- a self-assessment of Badminton Tasmania's governance policies and procedures against the Australian Sports Commission's 2025 Sports Governance Standards - designed to understand both current strengths and weaknesses in existing governance processes and procedures and the identification of areas for future improvement.

Child Safety

Badminton Tasmania strengthened its child-safe practices and procedures throughout the year through several key initiatives, including:

- ongoing education; Badminton Tasmania participated in workshops delivered by the Office of the Independent Regulator, Active Tasmania, and Sport Integrity Australia, supporting ongoing improvement of policies, processes, and education relating to safe environments for children and young people.
- the implementation of the Child Protection Risk Management Policy and online compliance system referred to earlier.
- an onboarding process for all new volunteers working with vulnerable people - the onboarding process ensures that volunteers are adequately trained and aware of their responsibilities and the latest industry specific practices reinforcing Badminton Tasmania's commitment to the safety and wellbeing of children and young people and improving its compliance with the National Principles for Child Safe Organisations and Tasmania's Child and Youth Safe Organisations Framework.
- enrolment in the Safeguarding in Sport Continuous Improvement Program (SISCIIP) in May 2025, Badminton Tasmania was formally accepted into the 18-month program being run by Sport Integrity Australia to assist state and national sporting organisations around Australia to strengthen their child-safety capability, processes and procedures and to meet compliance requirements. Badminton Tasmania will continue to work closely with Sport Integrity Australia during the program.
- the completion of a self-assessment process facilitated by Sport Integrity Australia - designed to understand both current strengths and weaknesses in existing child safety processes and procedures and the identification of areas for future improvement.




BOARD SKILLS & DIVERSITY MATRIX ASSESSMENT

In 2025, Badminton Tasmania board members undertook a Board Skills and Diversity Matrix assessment process aimed at identifying strengths and gaps in the skills and diversity of its board of directors as part of BT's commitment to good governance. The self-assessment process and discussions were guided by Active Tasmania Project Officer Matthew Etherington, and the following results and recommendations were corroborated. A big thank you to Matthew and Active Tasmania for affording us the invaluable opportunity to take this deep dive into our governance makeup and empowering the Board to shape Badminton Tasmania's future direction in a powerful and meaningful way.

The Board identified the following skills as the top 8 priorities for director recruitment and future leadership of the organisation:

- Governance
- Community Development
- Strategy, Policy and Planning
- Media and Communications
- Finance
- Member / Child Safeguarding
- Participation and Inclusion
- Risk Management



Matrix survey results of current director skills combined

Once priority areas had been established with each director's input, each board member then individually completed a survey to assess their strengths against each of those eight skill areas. The scores each board member gave themselves were then added together to determine the board's collective strengths and weaknesses. The areas identified as most collectively lacking were Legal and Finance, and the strongest scores were Community Development, Participation and Inclusion, and Member Protection / Child Safeguarding.

BT Board Diversity Tally

Diversity amongst the board was also examined as part of this process. Diversity is important to Badminton Tasmania's board, to be able to represent and consider the lived experience and cultures we serve in our sport. One strategy we have already implemented in the BT 2024-27 Operational Plan is to maintain gender diversity with no more than 40% of any gender on the board. Plans for future strategy being considered include maintaining an age gap of a certain number between oldest and youngest members on the board, and ensuring that in addition to recruiting new board members with the skills and experience in areas of priority, that we also look to include at least one person from Northern and/or regional Tasmania, and actively promote roles in those areas, as well as encourage indigenous people and people with a disability to apply.

In 2026, in light of the findings, the BT Board plans to:

- Review the processes for recruiting board members, and highlight skillsets identified as priorities in Position Descriptions and nominations processes.
- Conduct an annual review of the Skills Matrix, as well as after major transitions in Board composition.
- Revise key documents such as the Strategic & Operational plans to reflect the outcomes of the self-assessment.
- Develop and support directors through tailored professional development plans, with self-paced goals.
- As a board, complete the ASC's online training module in Board Director training, and set up other professional development opportunities Legal, Finance, and Governance.
- Form a Finance, Audit and Risk Committee with a formal Terms of Reference to assist in reducing workload and skill dependency on a single Board Member.
- Develop a formal succession plan using the Skills and Diversity Matrix.

This year Badminton Tasmania have had umpires at every sanctioned Tasmanian tournament, at the national Open carnival and all national junior carnivals. This is a minimal number and Pauline Dobson must be mentioned for her ongoing support in umpiring Tasmanian events and providing a service for the entire weekend of these events.

Tasmania currently has

- 15 active umpires
- 6 active Line judges
- 2 active referees

This notably includes;

- One member of the BWF umpire assessment panel – David Turner
- One BWF Line Judge – Karen Arnold
- Two Oceania Accredited umpires – Casim & Vicky Zhang

Follow up of umpires who have completed courses in 2024 is still underway, and we have an umpires course planned for early 2026.

There is a continual need to support and encourage umpires to contribute regularly to each event held in Tasmania. Some travel costs, refreshments and meals for a minimum amount of umpire hours is available at some events but must be offered consistently across all events.

Tasmania is again set to host two National events in 2026 and we must continue to provide umpires for these events.

We have two umpires nominate for assessment to a higher level in 2026 which is pleasing.

Congratulations to the Board of Badminton Tasmania for all the work they have undertaken over this year. Badminton has seen a growth in player numbers and a greater opportunity to be involved in the sport throughout the whole state.

Building Member Engagement

In 2025, Badminton Tasmania introduced quarterly liaison meetings with member clubs and associations to strengthen communication and support the ongoing improvement of participation programs around Tasmania. The meetings provided a simple and effective way to check in on program delivery, discuss upcoming activities, and ensure associations, clubs and Badminton Tasmania are working together toward shared participation goals.

Strengthening Child Safety & Compliance

Badminton Tasmania strengthened its child-safe practices throughout the year through several key initiatives. BT participated in workshops delivered by the Office of the Independent Regulator and Sport Integrity Australia, supporting ongoing improvement of policies, processes, and education relating to safe environments for children and young people.

In May 2025, Badminton Tasmania was formally accepted into Sport Integrity Australia's Safeguarding in Sport Continuous Improvement Program (SISCIPI) — an 18-month program designed to assist sporting organisations to strengthen child-safety capability and meet compliance requirements. BT will work closely with Sport Integrity Australia as the program progresses.

To support safer delivery across all programs, BT introduced a new online compliance system requiring coaches, officials, and volunteers to complete essential checks and acknowledgements and complete online courses. This process includes Working with Vulnerable People Registration, policy confirmation, and required training modules. The system provides BT with a clear and efficient way to maintain up-to-date compliance records and ensure consistency across the state.



Sporting Schools Program

Badminton Tasmania delivered the Shuttle Smash - Sporting Schools Program to 22 schools across Tasmania during 2024-25. This included 15 schools in Southern Tasmania, 6 in the North West, and 1 in Northern Tasmania.

A total of 3,460 students participated in fun and active badminton sessions delivered inside school hours. Many students experienced badminton for the first time, and coaches used shuttle feeders, modified equipment, and age-appropriate activities to support learning and engagement.

The Sporting Schools Program continues to be one of Badminton Tasmania's strongest participation products. Interest from schools is growing, with more than 20 school bookings for Terms 3 and 4 in 2025, demonstrating the increasing reach and popularity of the program and the sport.

Shuttle Smash Programs



Shuttle Smash: Come & Try Program:

One-off coaching sessions were held across multiple locations to introduce new players to badminton:

- Penguin: 1 & 2 October 2024, and 5 March 2025 & 7 April 2025
- Snug: 30 September & 3 October 2024
- Beaconsfield: 1 October 2024
- South Hobart: 24 & 29 April 2025

A total of 127 participants attended these sessions. Many later joined the Shuttle Smash: 10-Week Programs, supporting a strong participation pathway from introduction to regular play.



10-Week Shuttle Smash:

10-Week programs were delivered across five program locations:

- Girls Program (Hobart)
- Snug
- Penguin
- Beaconsfield
- Devonport

There were 193 Shuttle Smash program participants in total, with strong engagement from junior players across Tasmania. Programs were delivered after school or on weekends.



Shuttle Smash Gala Days:

Two major inter-school Shuttle Smash: Gala Day Competitions were delivered at the Burnie Sports Centre in Upper Burnie:

- Year 9 & 10 Gala Day – 15 August 2024 – 137 participants
- Year 7 & 8 Gala Day – 22 August 2024 – 223 participants

Together, the Shuttle Smash: Gala Day Competition engaged 360 students (179 girls and 181 boys) providing a positive competition environment and strengthening school engagement in the North West of Tasmania.



All Abilities & Para Badminton

Shuttle Smash: All Abilities Program

Badminton Tasmania continued to deliver inclusive badminton opportunities for people living with a disability across the state. The weekly Shuttle Smash: All Abilities Program held at the badminton centre in South Hobart engaged 9 participants each week throughout the year, providing a welcoming and supportive environment for children and adults. Sessions were consistently supported by parents, carers, coaches, and volunteers.

To broaden access beyond the south of Tasmania, Badminton Tasmania also delivered two All Abilities sessions in Penguin on 20 November and 4 December 2024, engaging 8 participants each week. These sessions strengthened inclusive participation in the North West of Tasmania and built positive connections with local disability organisations.

Abilities Unleashed – Launceston & Devonport

Badminton Tasmania partnered with Disability Sports Australia to deliver badminton sessions at two Abilities Unleashed events:

- Launceston – 15 November 2024 – 75 participants
- Devonport – 14 November 2024 – 95 participants

These events introduced 170 participants to badminton and created strong community connections in partnership with disability service providers.

Making Badminton More Accessible

Two badminton-specific sports wheelchairs were purchased with an equipment grant received from the Tasmanian Government, Department of State Growth (Active Tasmania). The wheelchairs are based at the badminton centre in South Hobart but are available for use by all associations and clubs across Tasmania.

The purchase and use of the two sports chairs was formally launched at the Hobart Invitational Badminton Championships, held in South Hobart in September 2025, in partnership with Badminton Hobart.

Badminton Tasmania acknowledges and thanks the Tasmanian Government, and the Department of State Growth (Active Tasmania) for the grant to enable the purchase of the two badminton-specific wheelchairs to assist Badminton Tasmania make badminton more accessible for all.

Shuttle Smash Evaluation Project

During the year, Badminton Tasmania, in conjunction with Badminton Australia, developed participant surveys that were issued to participants involved in all of Badminton Tasmania's Shuttle Smash Participation Programs, including the Shuttle Smash - All Abilities Program and the Shuttle Smash - 10 Week Programs.

The aim of the surveys were to evaluate the success of the programs by seeking feedback from participants about their experience.

Two surveys were issued to participants during the year:


- Phase 1 (Nov-Dec 2024): 47 responses
- Phase 2 (May-Jun 2025): 49 responses

Badminton Tasmania received a strong response rate of over 50%, with surveys issued to approximately 75-80 participants in each phase.

The results were consistently outstanding. Participants rated their experience:

- Enjoyment and overall experience: all ratings were 4 or 5 (out of 5)
- Feeling welcomed and included: all ratings of 4 and 5 (out of 5)
- Safety: all ratings of 4 and 5 (out of 5)
- Likelihood to recommend (NPS): 41 of 49 participants rated the program 9 or 10 (out of 10)

The results indicate strong engagement and participant satisfaction across all of Badminton Tasmania's Shuttle Smash Participation Programs.



Developing our coaches and officials

BWF Level 1 Coaching Course

Badminton Tasmania delivered its first Badminton World Federation Level 1 Coaching Course in June 2025, facilitated through a partnership between Badminton Tasmania, Badminton Hobart, and Badminton Oceania. Participants are currently finalising their post course work, with the expectation that seven new BWF Level 1 coaches will qualify, strengthening our coaching pathways statewide.

BWF Shuttle Time

A BWF Shuttle Time Face-to-Face Course was delivered on 24 October 2024 at the badminton centre in South Hobart, with 6 participants attending.

BA Foundation

Two Badminton Australia Foundation Coaching Courses were delivered during the year, with 3 participants on 4 August 2024 and another 3 on 24 November 2024. All six coaches successfully passed and are registered with Badminton Australia.

Introductory Umpire Course

A state-level introductory umpire course was delivered by Badminton Tasmania on 27 October 2024 at the Burnie Sports Centre in Upper Burnie. Four umpires participated; one has since become fully qualified, and the remaining three are completing their assessments at upcoming tournaments.

Umpire Assessment Support

Badminton Tasmania provided financial support to Vicky Zhang and Casim Casim to attend national and international events for assessment towards Oceania Accredited and Oceania Certificated umpire status. Their ongoing development enhances the state's officiating capability.

Creating pathways & developing our players

Performance Training Camp – Port Sorell

Badminton Tasmania delivered a two-day performance camp in February 2025 at the Port Sorell Banksia Centre, bringing together junior and senior players from across Tasmania for focused on-court development. The camp included technical sessions, match play, and opportunities for players to train alongside athletes from different regions, helping strengthen connections across the pathway. The camp was well received by participants and coaches and based on its success the camp will return in 2026 as a key annual development activity for Tasmanian players.



BA National U15 Training Camp – Melbourne

Four Tasmanian U15 athletes attended the Badminton Australia National U15 Development Camp in Melbourne from 29 May – 2 June 2025. The camp brought together players from across Australia and the New Zealand U15 National team, providing a strong development environment through technical training and match play.



Training with Olympian Gronya Somerville

Badminton Tasmania organised a special training session with Australian Olympian Gronya Somerville in April 2025 in Hobart as part of the Open Nationals, bringing together female players from the BT Shuttle Smash – 10 Week Program, Badminton Hobart, and state juniors from across Tasmania. The session provided high-quality coaching for 25 girls aged 10–18 and created a rare opportunity for local girls to learn directly from a world-class player and role model.



Hosting National Championships

Tasmania hosted two major national championship events in 2025. The Open National Championships (April 2025) were held at the badminton centre in South Hobart. The event was delivered by Badminton Australia, with Badminton Hobart hosting at their venue. In July 2025, the YONEX Australian U19 & U15 National Championships was held at the Elphin Sports Centre in Launceston. Having three such high level events in our state in 2025 has been a fantastic opportunity for our players, with many of the juniors in this year's state teams competing at their first ever national championships.



U19 Vic Country / TAS team

In 2024, Tasmania did not have the numbers to send an U19 team to the national championships in Perth. Rather than the few kids who did nominate for state team missing out, BT organised for players to compete in a composite team with regional Victorian players at the 2024 Victorian Teams Championships, held in October at MSAC in Melbourne. The team was managed by Jane Kabalan and coached by Abbie Rothery. Tasmanian players were Samia Kabalan, Daniel Mooney, and Nithika Samarabandu.
